Activity Name	<b>TSRT Federal Indian Policy Legacies and Continuing Impacts (eLearning)</b>
Office Sponsor	The State of Minnesota
Description	<p>This 75 minute course is the second in the Tribal-State Relations Training series. It serves to educate state agency staff about the historical eras of federal Indian policy as it pertains to tribal-state relations.</p> <p>This training is in response to the <u>Governor’s Executive Order</u> requiring state agencies to consult with tribes on matters of mutual interest. It has been developed by the Tribal-State Advisory Group (representative of many of the state agencies), the Minnesota Indian Affairs Council, the University of Minnesota-Duluth, the Indian Land Tenure, the Minnesota Humanities Center, the American Indian Policy Center, the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe and the White Earth Nation.</p> <p>(This is a Non-Credit Certificate Course)</p> <p>This eLearning is available to all state of Minnesota employees, on demand, through the Enterprise Learning Management (ELM), the state’s learning management system. ELM is available for all agencies to use.</p>
Objectives	<p>Participants completing this course will build a fundamental understanding of the historical and policy-orientated contexts in which the State of Minnesota engages with tribal nations so that employees may work more effectively with tribal governments and American Indians.</p> <p>Upon completing this course, you will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have an enhanced understanding of American Indian tribal sovereignty</li> <li>• Be able to differentiate major historical eras of federal policy regarding American Indian nations</li> <li>• Be able to consider the ongoing impacts of past and present policy on contemporary tribal-state relations.</li> </ul>

Registration Procedure	<p><u>Steps:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Sign into <a href="#">Self Service</a> with your employee ID (User Name) and password.</li> <li>2. Select <b>Enterprise Learning Mgmt (ELM)</b></li> <li>3. In the Learning Home, Quick Links section, select <b>Find Learning</b>.</li> <li>4. Type <b>TSRT Federal Indian Policy</b> into the “Title” field and select the <b>Search</b> button.</li> <li>5. Select the <b>Enroll</b> button. A new window will appear (Class Progress); select the <b>Launch</b> link (lower right corner)</li> <li>6. Select the <b>Launch</b> link on the Table of Contents page to start the course.</li> </ol>
