Qualifications

- Undergraduate or graduate student currently pursuing a degree in civil, construction, environmental, geoen지니어ing, or structural engineering
- Enrolled in two or more classes per semester/quarter
- Legally eligible for employment in the United States - proof of eligibility is required

Priority is given to students completing their junior year and those with a 3.0 GPA or higher

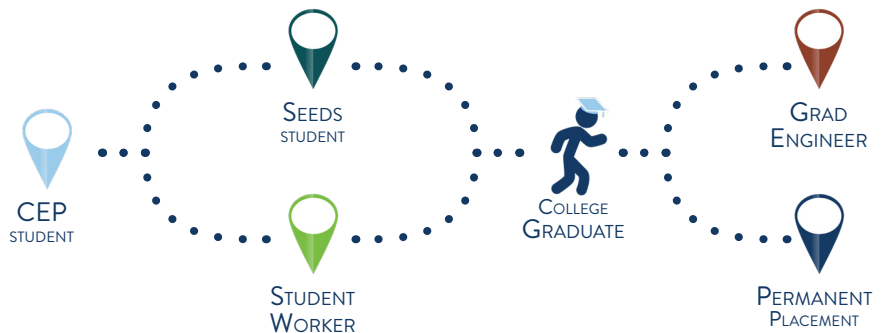
STUDENT WORKER PROGRAM

MnDOT's Civil Engineering Student Worker Program (CEP), in partnership with the Center for Transportation Studies, provides hands-on experience to college students majoring in civil, construction, environmental, geo, or structural engineering. Students are placed in a functional area of the agency including:

- Asset Management
- Bridge Construction
- Bridge Hydraulics
- Bridge Inspection
- Construction
- Environmental Stewardship
- Materials & Road Research
- Project Management
- Surveying
- Traffic
- Water Resources and more...

CEP students may have the chance to continue working at MnDOT through other student worker programs during the school year. Students entering their final year of college can apply for MnDOT's Graduate Engineer and Land Surveyor Program for potential placement upon graduation.
