Description	<p>This course is part of the Working with Minnesota Tribes Series. Each course in this series focuses on one of the 11 tribal nations in Minnesota. The course is designed to help guide state employees in their work and interaction with the tribal nations in Minnesota.</p> <p>This 45-minute course introduces you to the Grand Portage Band of Lake Superior Chippewa and features Grand Portage elected tribal leaders, employees and members who explain protocols and offer guidance on what you need to know when working with their government and staff.</p> <p>The online course uses a compilation of video interviews divided into three topic areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Culture and traditions • Tribal Government • Protocols and best practices for tribal-state relations <p>Tribal sovereignty is the basis of a tribe’s jurisdiction over people and activities on tribal lands. The views and information in this course are specific to Grand Portage, therefore it’s vital that you come prepared knowing about the Grand Portage Nation, government, people, and ways of life before conducting business.</p> <p>This eLearning has been developed in partnership with the Grand Portage Reservation Tribal Council and approved for use for State of Minnesota employees.</p> <p>(This is a Non-Credit Certificate Course)</p>
Course Objectives	<p>This course enables you to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approach your work with a better understanding of the Grand Portage people, government, and ways of life.

Identify ways in which the Grand Portage Band of Lake Superior Chippewa is unique among the 11 federally recognized Indian tribal governments that share geography with the State of Minnesota.

Under “Find Learning”, type “Grand Portage” in the search box to search for the course. Select the “TSRT Working with the Grand Portage Band of Lake Superior Chippewa” course, and then select “Enroll”, followed by “Go To Course”, and then “Launch”.</p>
