Proclamation

- WHEREAS:** A major landslide occurred on County State Aid Highway 21 (CSAH 21) in Nicollet County, Minnesota on June 18, 2020 as a result of saturated soils combined with a drawdown of the Minnesota River level; and
- WHEREAS:** The landslide event produced serious and extensive damage to public property, and Minnesota has sustained severe damage to its road systems, which include roadbeds and other facilities on Federal-aid highways; and
- WHEREAS:** The damage is of such an extent that immediate repairs and road closures have been necessary; and
- WHEREAS:** This condition constitutes an emergency as is contemplated by the terms of Sections 125 and 120(e) of Title 23 of the United States Code and is a disaster as defined in Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 12.03; and
- WHEREAS:** The immediate repair and reconstruction of the damaged highways is vital to the security, well-being, and health of the citizens of Minnesota.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, pursuant to Section 668.111(c) of Title 23 of the United States Code of Federal Regulations, do hereby proclaim the flooding in Nicollet County to be a disaster, causing the Minnesota Department of Transportation to seek Emergency Relief funding from the federal government.

The Federal Highway Division Administrator is hereby requested to concur in the declaration of this disaster.
