

GRADUATE LAND SURVEYOR TRAINING PROGRAM



MnDOT's Graduate Land Surveyor Training Program gives new land surveyors an opportunity to get to know the agency with hands-on experience before beginning a life-long career. Trainees gain practical work experience through formal job rotations with a variety of work groups at MnDOT. Expand your technical, leadership, and professional skills while familiarizing yourself with MnDOT's organizational structure, goals, policies, and personnel.

How the program works

New Land Surveyor Trainees participate in the program for up to two years, depending on their prior experience and the permanent needs of the department. Rotations last three to six months with at least one rotation located in the Central Office and one in a District Office.

Trainees work with their MnDOT advisor and the Graduate Program manager to develop a rotation plan based on the trainee's interests. Performance feedback is given during each rotation through a mid-point and final review.

The Graduate Land Surveyor Program offers a variety of opportunities for Trainees to participate in professional development, technical trainings, and networking with industry professionals.

Trainees will be appointed to a permanent job assignment as a Land Surveyor in Training upon successful completion of the program and possession of the Fundamentals of Surveying (FS).
