

## 2024 MnDOT Planning Internship Program Positions

### Metro District Planning Position

---

MnDOT's Metro District Long Range Planning unit is where we put state transportation policy into practice! In our group, you'll help with aspects of corridor studies and small area plans in the Twin Cities Region—including research, technical analyses, and community engagement. You'll work closely with experienced transportation planners and learn how MnDOT nurtures partnerships with cities, counties, businesses and organizations. You'll be asked to produce a variety of materials to support this planning, including maps, presentations and documents.

### Office of Aeronautics Planning Position

---

The intern working with MnDOT's Office of Aeronautics will be exposed to a broad range of aviation planning and industry topics. These functions include airport master planning, airport zoning, airspace protection and compatibility review, airport inspection, public engagement, and the implementation of the State Aviation System Plan. Our intern will gain an understanding of general aviation and how it supports the cities and towns across Minnesota.

### Office of Sustainability and Public Health Planning Position

---

The MnDOT Office of Sustainability and Public Health (OSPH) Intern will work on diverse projects that will build experience in planning areas such as data analysis, GIS, policy research, public engagement, evaluation, stakeholder consultation and federal grant implementation. Intern projects may support strategic partnerships, electrification of transportation, or resilience of the transportation system. The OSPH intern is a critical member of a fun and fast-moving team expanding sustainability in transportation, and supporting federal programs for reducing carbon pollution and improving public health.

### Office of Transit and Active Transportation Planning Position

---

The Active Transportation Planning Intern at MnDOT will work on a variety of projects that support walking and bicycling statewide. Work areas include supporting the Active Transportation and Safe Routes to School programs, modal planning efforts, demonstration projects, community engagement, GIS, data management, and more with flexibility to co-create an internship that supports individual interests while contributing to larger team goals. The AT Planning Intern will join a passionate, innovative, and industry-leading team to help make walking and bicycling an easy, safe, and desirable option for getting around.

## Office of Transportation System Management Planning Positions

---

The MnDOT Office of Transportation System Management (OTSM) is a great place for candidates wanting to understand how policy and investment decisions are made for Minnesota's multimodal transportation system. Work can vary from mapping, analysis, research, writing, stakeholder engagement, and more. Topics range from transportation equity to corridor planning guidance development. Intern projects support four OTSM teams: Corridor Planning, Investment Planning, Policy Planning, and Performance Risk and Investment Analysis. As a result, OTSM interns have the opportunity to align their work tasks with their skills and interests.
