Authority

The MDH is a member agency of the Minnesota Environmental Quality Board (MEQB) and has statutory authority for protecting the health of the citizens on Minnesota.

Agency Role(s)

The primary role of the MDH relative to MnDOT project development is in reviewing and commenting on project documents through the [MEQB Environmental Review Program](#).

MDH permits, approvals or notification may be required for groundwater wells (monitoring contaminated properties, construction dewatering or well sealing), drinking water supply, septic systems (rest areas), and asbestos or lead management.
